


Bulletproof Black Men

- The threat presumption of the Black man.


Dialogue Analysis: White scripts, Black faces - an analysis of authenticity.

Social Commentary:


- In-depth exploration of stereotypical plotlines and common origins of the 'urban' superhero.

Paradigm Shift: The new depiction of military genius - Black Women. The new commonplace of Black women in leadership roles in comic narratives.




Black Women as Leaders
