






#### What characterizes Neoliberalism?

- Politics and outcomes of Brexit, & autocrat's elections → Capital as both the CAUSE of anxiety/suffering, masquerading as it's savior
- Policies of 'Austerity' across the world; Corporate-Nationalist Political takeovers/domination in Brazil, Turkey, India, Russia, Israel, etc.
- Increasing privatization of social goods
- Increased spending on law enforcement/military
- Dissolution of barriers between corporate power/wealth and political power
- Increasing prominence of money as driving political decision making
- Breakdown of participatory democracy
- Mythologies of social mobility in the absence of tangible evidence of such; Rationalizing harsh economic and social Darwinism
- The notion that there is no viable or realistic alternative to free-market capitalism
- Sometimes called 'Zombie Capitalism' or 'Casino Capitalism', because the network of deregulation and distribution creates a strange phenomenon of no one actually BEING at the top, were you to try to trace out who is at the source of everything...it works like a zombie, without the need for a functioning consciousness. It is all of us, and none of us
- Pervasive across the political spectrum among the ruling elite.
- Intimately linked, & with a vested interest, in coloniality, racism, sexism, etc.

#### Basic Definition:

A faith in the unregulated free market to distribute both economic (money, etc.) & social resources (education, safety, freedom, etc.) in the most efficient, just, & fair fashion.

The market will determine how access to all things—including the common good—should be distributed.

Given this definition, that...

The market will determine how access to all things (including the common good) should be distributed

We arrive at some de facto, unstated assumptions about this 'take' on the free-market...

- Neoliberalism's Core Assumption(s):
  - Not everyone equally deserves access to freedom, or to the common good
  - 2. Those in power are entitled to buy, sell, use, etc. everything, including the public good, to advance their own wealth & power
  - 3. If you fail/struggle, it is down to your individual effort. You just didn't work hard enough; the problem is YOU.

\*These are COLONIAL assumptions, based in the idea that <u>some</u> people are INTRINSICALLY better, or <u>more</u> entitled to life, freedom, & the pursuit of happiness than others.

In practice, they also shake out along racialized lines.

- Neoliberalism is a Logic of Winners & Losers, even in realms where most modern societies have agreed there shouldn't be absolute-losers\*:
  - If everything is a competitive market, you will necessarily have losers in all markets. Should we have losers in the 'market' of early childhood education? Healthcare? Freedom from discrimination? Access to healthy living conditions?
  - If everything can be bought & sold for personal enrichment, who should get to 'buy & sell' public lands? Lands that were stolen through racist histories? Non-renewable resources?
- Just like with economic markets, existing capital (history) & relative position (who is rich & powerful NOW) are hugely determinate in predicting outcomes for the future
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\*This distinguishes it from Libertarianism, which still holds that the government should stay out of the economic market, but still protect people from injustice & exploitation.




#### The Fading American Dream

Percent of Children Earning More than their Parents, by Year of Birth




#### Racial Wealth Inequality Is Rampant In The U.S.


Median household wealth by race/ethnicity in the United States (1983-2024)













#### Child grows up in poverty

Family finds itself in poverty

Desperate situations lead to financial decline; in some cases, drug use, crime, & incarceration

Social programs are insufficient supports to meet rising costs of living

Poverty is a CYCLE that reproduces itself regardless of "hard work" or "initiative."


Though a SYSTEMIC process, we are socialized to see poverty & criminality as issues of INDIVIDUAL deviance

Disadvantaged in education & professional networks

Poor health due to food insecurity; lack of access to care

Struggles to find employment, training, or higher education

#### Superheroic Thinking & Neoliberalism

Batman isn't alone—Many Superheroes (Ironman, Green Arrow, Reed Richards/Mr. Fantastic, etc.) fall into the same archetypal category.

- What does that tell us about the world-view, ideology, & nature of superheroic thinking?
- What are the implicit assumptions about the rich that are normalized here? How do those stack up with reality?
- How do their various alliances/ friendships/ relationships to 'everyman' superheroes relate to our social narratives?

- American billionaires are now nearly 20% richer by \$565 billion, to be exact — than they were at the start of the coronavirus pandemic, according to a new report by the Institute for Policy Studies.
- The coronavirus crisis has been an economic disaster for the rest of America, as an unprecedented 42.6 million Americans filed for unemployment benefits in the past 11 weeks.
- The job losses have disproportionately affected black Americans, and the country's racial wealth gap has just kept on growing. The Washington Post reports the gap is in many ways unimproved and in other ways worse since 1968, when a host of historic civil rights legislation was passed.







Bowles and Gintis: the relationship between intelligence, educational attainment and meritocracy

#### Superheroic Thinking & Neoliberalism

- Comic universes also give us wealthy villains—what are the differences we are supposed to see between Bruce Wayne/Batman, & Lex Luthor?
- Are those differences substantive? (i.e. are Luthor & Bruce Wayne really all that different?)



#### Superheroic Thinking & Neoliberalism

- Who are our "real life" corollaries to Batman, Lex Luthor, Ironman, etc.?
- What does the persistence of superheroic thinking & 'Batman' narratives do for their political power & prosperity?
  - What does it do to us?
- Do we want to live in Bruce Wayne/Lex Luthor's world?





#### So....?

- At its core, Neoliberalism is the ideology of free-market capitalism applied universally (i.e. to democracy, government, the social state, community & interpersonal interactions, etc.).
- At its most fundamental level, this reduces everything and everyone to a commodity, each with our varying levels of marketability, utility, & disposability.
- If you aren't the 1%, you are a disposable body/commodity owed nothing that you cannot yourself claim through your own independent means (e.g. education for you and your family, access to health care & housing, access to public lands & resources)

What do our societal aspirations to be/be like Batman, our Batman idolatry, tell us about our neoliberal reality & ourselves?

Put in VERY simple terms, Neoliberalism is a TOXIC REWRITING of the SOCIAL CONTRACT (the unspoken agreement of those in shared society that allow them to coexist) to JUSTIFY INEQUALITY and PRESERVE THE STATUS of those already experiencing privilege and power.

#### Superheroic Thinking & Neoliberalism

As Giroux notes....

"For over 30 years, the American public has been reared on a neoliberal dystopian vision that legitimates itself through the largely unchallenged claim that there are no alternatives to a market-driven society, that economic growth should not be constrained by considerations of social costs or moral responsibility, and that democracy and capitalism are virtually synonymous. At the heart of this corporate driven market rationality is an egocentric philosophy and culture of cruelty that sell off public goods and services to the corporate and private sectors while simultaneously dismantling those public spheres, social protections, and institutions serving the public good." – Giroux

- If we are meant to rely on/submit to the 'merit' of Batman/Luthor/Stark & their genius & wealth, what does that say about our own democratic agency?
